Ag Commissioner	Hank Gilbert defeated Kinky Friedman in the Democratic primary and will challenge current Commissioner Todd Staples in the general election
Supreme Court Place 3	One percentage point separated the top four candidates; Rick Green and Debra Lehman will compete in a runoff
Congress	Of the 32 Members of Congress, 14 incumbents had contested primaries and all prevailed
State House	Four Price defeated Victor Leal in the HD-87 Republican Primary (Sherman-Moore-Carson-Potter) <u>5 incumbents were defeated</u> in the primary including: Betty Brown (R-District 4); Tommy Merritt (R- District 7); Dora Olivo (D-District 27); Tara Rios Ybarra (D- District 43); and Al Edwards (D- District 146) <u>3 incumbents are involved in run-offs</u> including: Representatives Fred Brown (R- District 14); Norma Chavez (D-District 76); and Delwin Jones (R- District 83) There will be <u>run-offs in 6 other districts</u> including: House Districts 46, 52, 66, 84, 127, and 149.
